Assisted Suicide Bill - Message from Bishop Tom: On Friday 11th September the House of Commons will debate and vote on a bill to legalise assisted suicide. This will put the most vulnerable people in our society at risk. Please contact your MP, urging him/her to attend the debate and to vote against the Bill. F. Every parish should have welcoming people at the door,

Many parishioners would be grateful if they did not have to pass through a minefield of hand-outs and collections on the way out of church.

G. The style of music can be too slow.

Styles of music don't please everybody; they use unfamiliar tunes, are sometimes off-putting and intrusive/loudly amplified/artificial, too long. Music groups and choirs seem to be deaf to people's pleas, and continue their ways and choices oblivious to remarks made to them. At the same time, the choices made by other groups are just right.

H. Inter-action, consultation, listening, participation, sharing.

These areas have all been underlined, affecting how the Mass is presented, as well as getting involved in meetings. There were requests for more of these "Gandhi" gatherings to take place, and more of these kinds of topics to be dealt with, with more time and in greater detail. This would be appreciated in the future, both at diocesan level, but particularly and more regularly at parish level.
