## **Evangelii Gaudium Sunday**

(from Archbishop Mark)

In the past, the third Sunday of September has been known as "Home Missions Sunday". This has now been changed to *Evangelii Gaudium* (Joy of the Gospel) Sunday to better reflect the Holy Father's inspiration and the work of the Mission Department of the Bishops' Conference—supporting Mission in three important areas—

- Firstly, evangelisation and catechesis. Guided by the Bishops this work supports the dioceses in bringing
  the beauty of the Catholic Faith to the people in their parishes and to those who do not already know
  the Lord.
- Secondly, the beauty of the Liturgy and our church building. The Mission Directorate ensures that liturgical directives from Rome are acted upon and liturgical texts are translated into English. Historical building experts work in the Directorate and support dioceses to fund and maintain beautiful places for prayer.
- Thirdly, sharing the beauty of the Catholic Faith with Christians and non-Christians through outreach
  and dialogue. This work supports the bishops at the national level and helps create greater
  understanding. The Directorate also reaches out to those with no faith but who seek the Lord "with a
  sincere heart"
