The Year of the God Who Speaks: The Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales has designated the year from Sept. 2019 to Dec. 2020 as the 'Year of the God Who Speaks'. It begins on 30th September 2019, on the feast of St. Jerome, the great scholar of the Bible and the first to translate it from the Hebrew into Latin. The year will end on 31st December 2020.

Before he retired, Bishop Tom Burns appointed Fr. Jerome Ituah as a Scripture Champion to promote the 'Year of the God Who Speaks' within the Diocese of Menevia.

Archbishop George will pre-launch the Year on Saturday 19th October at 11.00am at St. Mary's Church, Carmarthen. Plans to date for the Year of the Word will be unveiled during the event. There will be refreshments afterwards.

This month, each parish will be receiving copies of St. Matthew's Gospel and a beautiful Poster Trail.

This weekend there is a Pastoral Letter from Archbishop George, entitled "Celebrating God's Word" (copies available after Mass). And on Saturday 16th November there will be a Deanery launch at St. Joseph's, Port Talbot from 11.00am until 2.00pm, beginning with Mass.
