Simple Campaign action request from CAFOD (15-16TH July). Fix the Food System: Over centuries small farmers worldwide have produced a great deal of food by saving, using, swapping and selling their seeds. The variety of seeds has been vital to making their crops more resilient and less vulnerable to climate change, thereby enabling farmers to feed local communities and to export to countries including the U.K. New laws threaten these sustainable practices. The World Bank is making it a condition of lending to developing countries that farmers buy expensive seed from powerful agricultural companies instead. Salina from Bangladesh is a small farmer. She says, "To keep the seed in our own hands is the main thing. Without seeds being a farmer is not possible". When farmers lose, we all lose! Next Sunday there will be a chance to add our support to Salina's plea to the World Bank. By the simple act of signing a giant copy of her letter it will give small farmers great encouragement and make the call by the Catholic community for justice to be heard at the meeting of the World Bank in October.
